Patient Reported Outcomes from Osteopathic Care: European results

The National Council for Osteopathic Research (ncor.org.uk) has been collecting patient reported outcomes from osteopathic patients, in this presentation we are able to share their responses about how they have responded to osteopathic care and their satisfaction with care received.

Presentation 2

The effectiveness of Osteopathic care for infantile colic: Results from a randomised controlled trial (CUTIES)

This was a two arm randomised controlled trial testing osteopathic care against light touch alone for the treatment of infants (less than 10 weeks) with colic, i.e. excessively crying infants who are distressed and difficult to console but healthy and thriving. The primary outcome was crying time, other outcomes were parenting confidence, overall impression of change, adverse events and satisfaction with care. The results will be presented.
